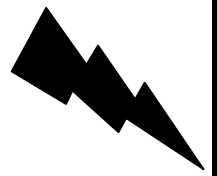

Protocol: We should all be alert and help with relays (QSP) when asked; however, remember proper protocol: the NCS is always in charge and will ask for help when needed. In our desire to help let us be sure that we are not causing greater problems by interfering with net procedures. Always wait for the NCS to request help. If you hear QSP?, send you call and Wait to be acknowledged by the NCS. After acknowledgement let him know that you can copy (QNJ) the station under question. The NCS will then give you instructions as to what he needs.

Antenna Problems: One side of my G5RV came loose, but before it fell from the tree, the insulator became lodged in the tree. Hopi ng to simply pull it out and restring the antenna, (anticipating a simple one-hour job), the insulator, I discovered, was not only stuck it was "welded" into the tree. Dayton: A few weeks ago, I attended the Dayton Hamvention and the QRP Amateur Radio Club International's Four Days in May (FDIM) Symposium. For those of us who are QRP enthusiasts, FDIM is quite a grand experience. This year was no exception. The 200 participants were enlightened by nine in-depth one-hour-plus seminars which took place on Thursday, the day before the Hamvention begins. The presenters were some of the well-known hams in QRP circles such as L.B. Cebik, George Dobbs, Joe Everhardt, and others. During the rest of the week, there were other equally enjoyable activities and a banquet where over \$2000 in prizes was given away. These prizes ranged from some very expensive QRP transceivers to less modest items. (I won a copy of "The HW-8 Handbook.") The highlight of the banquet was a talk by Wayne Burdick, N6KR, developer of the Elecraft K-2 – the "cadillac" of the QRP transceiver kits. (By the way, those of you who may be interested in purchasing a QRP rig, keep your eyes out for the K-1 which is coming out in August. This is a two-band kit (80 and 20 meters) and has many of the same features found in the K-2, and, at \$269, it will be considerably less expensive.)

The Hamvention is always much too crowded for me (3000 hams in attendance this year., but I do enjoy "grazing" through the giant flea market and seeing all the new "whistles and bells" that are being developed. Two items that caught my eye were the new K-1 rig, mentioned above, and the new HF rig by Ten Tec. As you know, the Pegasus came out about a year ago. This rig is designed to interface with one's computer which completes the rig. The Pegasus FP ("FP" is for front

panel) is a complete rig (no computer needed) and really looks first class. At about half the price of the Omni VI and many extra features, this may become my new rig to "lust" for.
