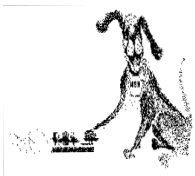

January brought 28 stations to the net which generated a QNI of 423 and a QTC of 54. Having perfect attendance was WA3DUH and WB5ZJN. Eleven (about 40%) of our members had a QNI of 25 to 31., and for our other loyal supporters of HBSN, we thank you for your contribution. Everyone is important, and everyone's participation is appreciated.

Early Dismissal: If you find yourself pressed for time, don't hesitate to QNI and ask for an early dismissal. When you need to be dismissed early, there are three ways this can be done. When you check in state the number of minutes you can remain on the net by sending (1) OUT IN TEN, (2) QNO TEN, or (3) QNX. If the NCS gets busy and doesn't get back to you in the requested time, get the NCS' attention and send QNO and your call. Your "friendly" NCS will always try to honor your request.

Thanks: I am happy to announce that the unnecessary pre-net dits and dahs have dropped way off. We still have the QRM guy hanging around, but, remember, the best way to handle him is to ignore him. He will eventually get bored and move on to pester someone else. Whatever you do, don't empower him by acknowledging his childish behavior. That is exactly what he wants us to do. PROFILE : W2EAG, Mark Rappaport

I got my start and interest in Amateur Radio when a family moved in next door and a boy my age, 15 had just got his Novice ticket. My brother, 4 years younger than us always tagged along with us

wherever we went, so he got interested at the same time. We all joined the audio-visual group in school, providing lights, sound etc for school plays, band, choir, and other functions. We spent many hours upstairs in his shack working mostly 40 and 15 meters with a rockbound 50 watt transmitter and an old Hammerlund rcvr.

My brother, now WA2AWG, got his ticket first, in 57. The next year, 58, my neighbor and I joined the Navy, a week after graduating High School. Being that I already knew the code, and had some basic technical experience in electronics, I scored high in those areas in boot camp. So, off to Radioman's school I went. I served four years of service aboard several different ships, and did a years service at the Naval Communications

Station,(NSS) about a year, just outside of Washington, DC.

While I was home on leave, in 1959, I went down to NYC and passed my novice exam after being pressured by my brother. I got the call WV2FNK. That call expired while I was away on duty. I didn't know there was a dispensation to military personnel from the FCC, and I let it lapse.

Several years later, I retested and got WB2EAG. It was around 1971 when I stumbled across the New England Novice Net (NENN), and was curious as to what was going on. I gave my call, and the NCS explained the whole procedure to me, and invited me to QNI the next day, which I did.

I was hooked! I've been a traffic handler ever since. By the way, my first checkin on that net was a busy one, as many of the stations had QTC for me welcoming me into the folds of the net. I had a heck of a time putting it down on paper as I didn't know the Amateur Message Form, but I got through it.

To make a long story a lot shorter, The following years rewarded me with an ORS and many other Field Appointments. In compliance with ARRL's wishes for the NTS to adhere to all four cycles, I grandfathered NYS/M (morning), cycle 1.

It wasn't long after, that New Jersey followed suit. Both nets are still going strong and provide a much needed outlet for traffic, especially when conditions at night are not good. The morning, C/I nets, can get the overflow etc.

My main interest today is training others to become traffic handlers. I have written a very comprehensive training guide for instructors who want to train. It is geared mainly for training on phone nets, but has enough CW language written in to get the interest of those willing to do CW nets, and the last sessions are dedicated to CW traffic handling.
